



## Providing Portable, At-Home Dental Services

In collaboration with the Missouri Coalition for Oral Health, Enable Dental is implementing a pilot program for teledentistry to serve individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Our dental team brings portable equipment and dental care into a patient's home, dayhab or community.

- Reduced fees for non-covered Medicaid services

### Qualification for Pilot Program.

Patient must meet all of the following:

- Live in Cass, Clay, Jackson or Platte county
- Must be a Missouri Medicaid recipient
- Has been diagnosed with one intellectual or developmental disorder

### Program goals include:

- Improving oral health outcomes
- Providing oral health education
- Increasing access to dental care
- Identify and understand community need for at-home and portable dental services

# What to Expect with Teledentistry



## Prior to Visit:

Completion of New Patient Consent Form.

**Visit #1: Hygienist**  
Arrive at patient's dayhab, community center or private residential home.



## Assessment & Cleaning

Collect patient's medical and dental history, capture x-rays, 3D scan, intraoral images, and documents assessment.

**Teledentistry Examination**  
Dentist reviews patient's medical history, images and notes in order to provide a diagnosis.



## Teledentistry Summary

Clinical Practice Manager will contact patient's responsible party and coordinate next visit (if applicable).

**Visit #2: Dentist - Treatment**  
Team arrives at patient's home. Dentist performs any accepted treatments.



## Recall: Routine Visits

Our administrative team will contact patient's responsible party when the next routine appointment is scheduled.
